

Financial Disclosure Statements

The following tables show compliance with filing Financial Disclosure Statements for CY2019 by agency, boards and commissions. The Office of Ethics and Accountability processed nearly (1,200) Financial Disclosure Statements during FY2020 as designated filers must file disclosures for the previous calendar year.

Financial Disclosure Statement Exemptions and Waivers

During Fiscal Year 2020, the Board of Ethics received three (3) requests for FDS exemption associated with 2019 Financial Disclosure Statements. The Board voted to exempt one Board/Commission from the FDS filing requirement and determined another Board/Commission as outside the scope of their purview. Additionally, one request for exemption was reviewed by Legal Counsel and determined as requiring formal issuance of Executive Order to identify the filing status.

Financial Disclosure Statement Late Fee Waiver Requests

Financial Disclosure Statements are typically due on April 30 of each calendar year; however, in FY2020, due to reduced governmental operations related to COVID-19, the Board of Ethics extended the date of assessment of late filing fees to July 31, 2020. In FY2020, any individual who failed to submit their completed form to the Office of Ethics and Accountability by July 31, 2020 was subject to a late fee at the rate of \$2.00 per day up to a maximum of \$250.00 in accordance with Section 2-292 of the County's Ethics Code. These requests will be discussed confidentially in closed sessions of Board of Ethics meetings. The Board of Ethics has delegated the review of late fees waivers to the Office of Ethics and Accountability and appeals of denials are provided to the Board of Ethics for determination. There have been seven (7) requests to waive late fees received related to the filing of the calendar year 2019 Financial Disclosure Statements.
