Mayor Kulpa-Eddy retired from her career as a veterinarian with the U.S. Department of Agriculture in 2019. She has lived in Berwyn Heights since 2000 along with her husband of over twenty years.

Mayor Takisha D. James

Mayor Takisha D. James was elected as the first African American female mayor of the Town of Bladensburg in October 2017 and reelected in 2021. A Bladensburg resident for more than 20 years, she lives with her husband, former Mayor Walter L. James, Jr., and their daughter Imani. Before seeking elected office, she developed a passion for community service as a volunteer for the Bladensburg Police Department's Community Oriented Police Unit, hosting a number of community events to help foster strong, positive relationships among the Bladensburg Police Department and minority residents. Since being elected, Mayor James has worked with Town Council Members and staff to bring resources to the Bladensburg community, including more than \$600,000 in computer donations from the State of Maryland for local schools and more than \$5.5 million in federal support (through the CARES Act and ARPA) for residents affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mayor Takisha D. James is the second Mayor James in the Town of Bladensburg, having succeeded her husband, Mayor Walter L. James, Jr. in 2017. There has been a Mayor James serving in the Town of Bladensburg for the past 16 consecutive years.



Fun Fact About Bladensburg

While the two Mayors James' are the first spouses to serve as Mayors in Bladensburg, they are not the first relatives to do so. Susanna K. Cristofane was the Town's Mayor for a decade (1975-1985) and her daughter, H. Susanna Cristofane Yatman subsequently served as Mayor from 1993-1995. The Cristofane family owned and resided in the Bostwick House (1746), the historic home of the first US Secretary of the Navy and one of the few remaining colonial structures still standing in Bladensburg. This Georgian mansion is on the National Register of Historic Places and, in 1997, Bostwick was sold to the Town of Bladensburg to ensure its preservation as a piece of United States, Maryland, Prince George's County, and Bladensburg history.

In 1969, Petrella was employed by the United States Information Agency where she obtained her top-secret security clearance. In 1975, she became the first female computer operator for the agency. Through much reorganization, she worked for the Voice of America as a computer technician. She started the first computer operations at the agency with her expertise. Petrella also served as the treasurer of the Carl T. Rowan Blacks in Government. She retired from the agency in 2005 after 36 years of dedicated service. Mayor Robinson began her civic duty by becoming President of the North Brentwood Recreation Council, President of North Brentwood Citizens Association and councilperson for North Brentwood. She was later appointed as town clerk. After her tenure as clerk, she ran for Mayor of the town in 2007 and still serves today.

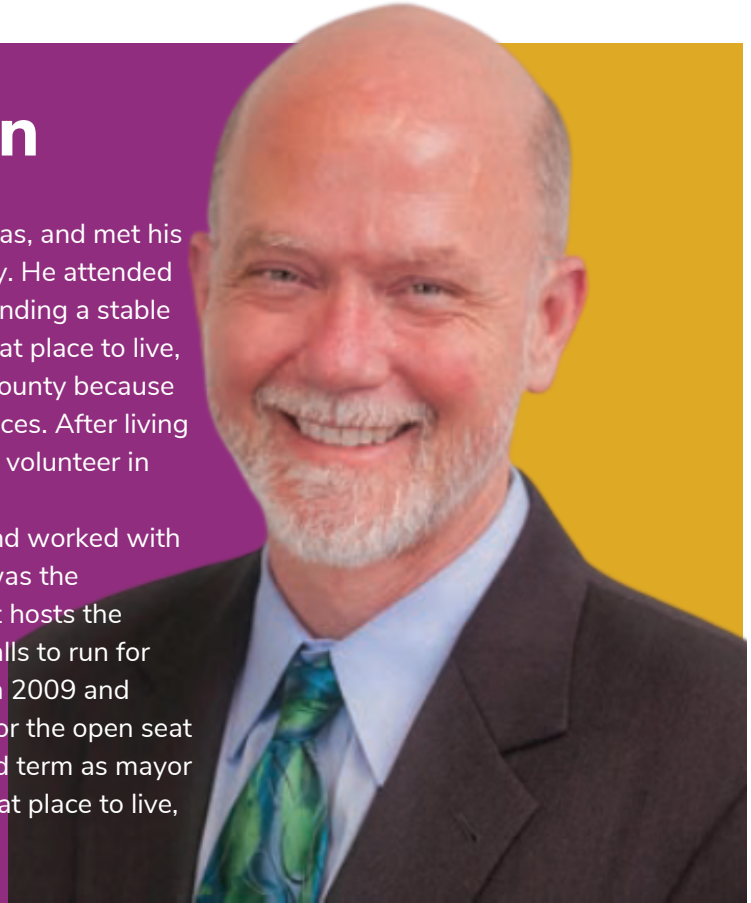

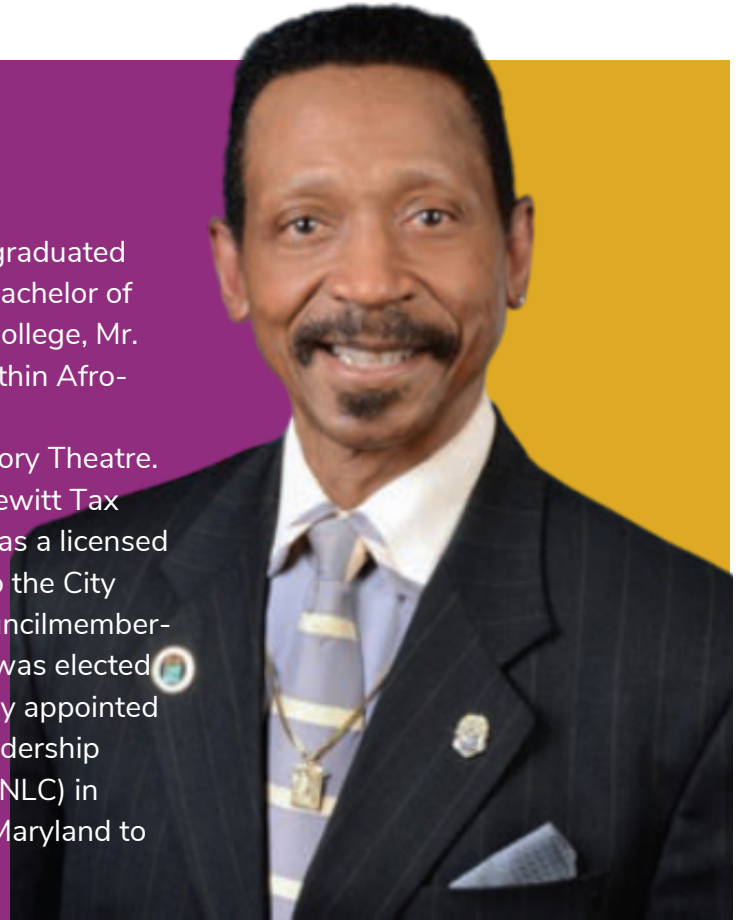
