BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article - State Government Section 9-1A-31(a)(1), (2), and (3) Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Government Section 9–1A–31(a)(7) Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 1 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (8) of this subsection, the local impact 2 grants provided under § 9-1A-27 of this subtitle shall be distributed as provided in this 3 subsection. 4 (2)following amounts shall be distributed to the following jurisdictions: 5 6 (i) Allegany County - \$200,000; 7 Cecil County - \$130,000; (ii) 8 (iii) Town of Perryville – \$70,000; and 9 Worcester County - \$200,000. (iv) 10 (3)The remaining funds for local impact grants shall be distributed in the 11 following manner: 12 (i) 82% to the local jurisdictions with video lottery facilities, based on each jurisdiction's percentage of overall gross revenues from video lottery terminals; and 13 14 except as provided in paragraph (4) of this subsection, for (ii) operations at a video lottery facility starting in fiscal year 2012 and ending in fiscal year 15 16 2032, 18% to Baltimore City with the Pimlico Community Development Authority acting 17 as the local development council in accordance with subsection (d) of this section, to be distributed primarily for capital projects benefiting economic and community development 18 19 in the following manner: 20 at least 75% in a manner that is consistent with the Park 1. 21Heights Master Plan; and 222. the remainder dedicated to the needs of: 23any census blockgroup that Baltimore City identifies as Α. being located partly or entirely within 1 mile of Pimlico Race Course but not within the 2425boundaries of the Park Heights Master Plan in a manner that is consistent with adopted 26 neighborhood priorities: 27 В. any neighborhood included in the Northwest Community 28 Planning Forum Strategic Neighborhood Action Plan in a manner that is consistent with 29 the adopted Northwest Community Planning Forum Strategic Neighborhood Action Plan 30 priorities; and
- C. beginning after a video lottery operation license is issued to a video lottery facility in Baltimore City, any neighborhood within an area bounded by Liberty Heights Avenue, Northern Parkway, Druid Park Drive, and Wabash Avenue in a manner that is consistent with adopted neighborhood priorities.

12	AMOUNTS SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO THE TOWN OF FOREST HEIGHTS:
13	1. \$112,500 IN FISCAL YEAR 2018;
14	2. 2% IN FISCAL YEAR 2019; AND
15	3. 3% IN FISCAL YEAR $2020.$
16	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
17	1, 2018.
